<u>Senior A</u> The season was again marked by erratic performances. An early outright win over Cambridge, who had been unbeaten for two seasons, augured well. However, after Christmas there were some heavy defeats followed by improved play at the end of the season. For the first time for several seasons the team was not last in the Senior Championship competition. We hope that this is the beginning of a steady climb up the ladder. More attention to concentration in batting, accuracy in bowling and more activity in the field are the requirements to bring about a higher placing for our Club.

<u>Senior B</u> A satisfactory season was experienced by this team and improvement was shown in all phases of the game. <u>Fifth Grade</u> The most notable and worthwhile feature of the Club's activities during the season was the sponsoring of two teams in this grade. The Club is very appreciative of the efforts of Mr Ken Truscott, who organised these teams, and for the time he spent with the boys at their matches on Saturdays and at their practices during the week. The two teams had a very successful season and many of the 26 boys who regularly attended practice showed definite promise of a bright cricket future. Good performances were recorded by - N. Cox, sound bat and wicket keeper, J. Davis, promising bat and bowler, E. Anderson, bowler, F. Edwards, promising bat and bowler, T. Riley, D. Wilson, M. Lamb and P. Fletcher. In competition matches the boys dress, punctuality, behaviour and keenness in the field was exemplary. A match arranged with a team from the Kereone school resulted in a handsome victory for the home side.
